

We the People: The Citizen and the Constitution helps students understand the history and principles of our constitutional government. The program focuses on the U.S. Constitution and Bill of Rights and fosters civic competence and responsibility among upper elementary, middle, and high school students in public and private schools nationwide.

The Grand Teton Summer Institute is a rigorous professional development program that brings educators to the scenic Teton Science Schools--Jackson Campus to work with constitutional scholars from a variety of disciplines. Participants attend lectures and sessions dedicated to teaching methods appropriate to the We the People curriculum. They also participate in a simulated congressional hearing modeled on the We the People culminating activity.



The following topics are addressed in lectures and in teaching methods and assessment sessions:

- What are the historical and philosophical foundations of the American political system?
- How did the framers create the Constitution?
- How has the Constitution been changed to further the ideals contained in the Declaration of Independence?
- How have the values and principles embodied in the Constitution shaped American institutions and practices?
- What rights does the Bill of Rights protect?
- What challenges might face American Constitutional Democracy in the twenty-first centrury?



Participants will receive

- Mileage stipend
- Lodging and meals
- A selection of constitutional literature
- College credit and continuing education credit will be available



Participation in the institute, which is considered professional development worth more than \$2000, obligates the recipient to conduct a simulated congressional hearing in his/her classroom. State and congressional district coordinators will assist with the hearing and other aspects of program implementation.
